Until the ATE Simple Paint arrived, no-one had considered treating the air before the spray gun. This ensures no contaminant in the air to spoil the sprayed surface, and because it de-ionises the air, lower air pressure is used which dramatically reduces overspray. The unit is a simple retro-fit to any existing spray set-up, water or solvent based.

Up to a 20% saving, sometimes more, of paint and lacquer can be achieved. Contamination of the work-piece and environment is virtually eliminated. Some major users in the UK have reported very significant improvements to their finishing process.
